Smarter ways of working

Infrastructure-related carbon dioxide emissions are reduced

Scotland's public sector organisations are considering office workspace as a target for creating a smaller, leaner, greener, and more effective and smarter property estate, an initiative the Scottish Future Trust (SFT) has led on for a number of years . The essence of this approach is increased sharing in fewer buildings, improving collaboration, delivering significant efficiencies and savings, and identifying opportunities for wider benefits based on new modern ways of working.

As part of SFT's space and money-saving Smarter Ways of Working programme, which is running across many public sector organisations, Registers of Scotland embraced the opportunity to change the way it works and moved to a more flexible way of working.

The relocation of Registers of Scotland from Hanover House to St Vincent Plaza and the delivery of flexible workspace resulted in a 75% reduction in carbon. SFT worked with RoS to help them understand how smarter working could help them deliver efficient and effective workspaces for their people.
